1. How/when WWI started?

Archduke Franz Ferdinand was assassinated by a Serbian member of the Black Hand.

War was declared on July 28th, 1914. Austria - Hungary, Germany and Italy were on one side. Britain, Russia, France, Canada, NL, Australia on the other side. War ended Nov. 11th, 1918 when the armistice was signed.

Military: **Royal Naval Reserve:** this was our navy, fought on the ocean, 2050, they were the ones ready to go right from the start. **Newfoundland Regiment:** had to be 19-36 to join, they were the army, the first 500 were known as the Blue Puttees (the leg wrap was blue as they ran out of khaki), most people enlisted in this (6240) - caribou, only branch to get called royal during WW1.

Non-military: **VAD** (volunteer aid detachment) - healthcare workers - female nurses (40) - tended to the injured /merchant marine (5000)- used to transport supplies by boat to Europe, unarmed, they were not in the Book of Remembrance/ **Forestry Corps** (500) - cut wood for fuel, trenches, buildings. Did this in Scotland.
